FROM ONE NEIGHBOR TO ANOTHER A PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Winter is officially behind us, and it was rather mild as judged by not having to cover our plants again this year. Spring officially started on March 20th. As we move into a new season, the leaves have stopped dropping off the trees, the temperatures will continue to rise, and our weekly attention now changes to the grass which is starting to grow faster. It's

the time to continue to enjoy those walks on Cady Way Trail, spruce up our yards and just take pleasure in the weather as last summer was another hot one! We are lucky to live in such a well-established community close to many services and nature.

The WPPCA turns 63 years old on May 16, 2025! For those early residents you will remember the early days of the Pines but for many residents, the community has been around longer than you!

These are just some of the events and highlights from 1962 when the WPPCA started:

- John Glenn blasted off from Cape Canaveral in Friendship 7 and became the first American to orbit the Earth.
- Bob Dylan first performed Blowing in the Wind on April 16th in a club on West 4th Street, New York.
- The Cuban missile crisis was in October.
- The First Walmart discount store and the 1st Kmart stores opened.
- The US Navy SEALS were created.
- James Meredith became the first African American student to enroll at the University of Mississippi.
- Telstar first live trans-Atlantic television signal.
- Goldfish Crackers & Chips Ahoy! were invented.
- The first computer video game, Spacewar, was invented.
- Audio cassettes were invented.
- Jackie Robinson became the first African American to be elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame.
- The first James Bond film, Dr. No, was released.
- The Taco Bell fast food restaurant chain was founded.
- 1962 costs: loaf of bread was \$.22, a Ford Galaxy was \$2,645, a gallon of milk was \$1.00, a gallon of gas was \$0.31, average income was \$6,000, a first-class stamp was \$.04, a movie ticket was \$0.70, and the average cost of a new home was \$18,200.

Over the past 63 years a lot has also happened in our community. The early days consisted of the planning and developing the Pines. When the WPPCA was created in 1962 residents stepped up to form our association to ensure we were a planned community to thrive for many decades to come. I want to personally thank those hundreds of residents who have served as Officers, Directors, and Committee Members or just helped to keep our organization strong and the Pines a preferred place to live in Central Florida. We continue to rely on residents to keep our community alive and engaged by giving of their time and talent. Just think, our voluntary association membership only cost \$6.00 in 1962 and sixty-three years later it only cost \$60.00; although we have many residents that contribute at much higher levels. It is the dedicated commitment of these residents who pay their membership each year that keeps your WPPCA going.

As your 38th President in my 5th term, I look forward to continuing to serve the Pines and look forward to your contribution of time, talent, and financial contributions. We have grown since 1962, and a lot has changed but what hasn't changed over the past 63 years is the dedication of so many Pines residents and I am very appreciative by all the time our volunteers put in.

Mall Maintenance Committee

A Community's Commitment To Maintain Our Neighborhood Entrance

Upon entering our main Winter Park Pines Community, commonly called the "Mall,", located on N Ranger Blvd off Aloma Avenue you see three (3) well-kept medians. The Winter Park Pines entrance stands as a testament to the collective effort and pride of its residents. These medians and the sides of the boulevard are maintained by your WPPCA "Mall Maintenance Committee".

With no obligation except from our community, the Mall has been maintained since the Pines development was first being built in the 60's. On September 19, 1994, an agreement was signed between Orange County (who owns the land) and the WPPCA granting rights to the WPPCA to conserve our entrance. The agreement ran for 25 years and automatically renews every 10 years thereafter. Our WPPCA is responsible for continuously maintaining the landscaping, irrigation system, signage, and lighting. By working closely with county officials, the committee addresses any concerns and secure the necessary approvals for their enhancement plans. This partnership allows the WPPCA to undertake larger projects that significantly improve the entrance's appearance.

Every Thursday morning, our dedicated committee volunteers, Fran Frataccia, Carol Magierski and Kyle Schafer meet to ensure the Pine's entrance remains a welcoming and attractive sight for all who pass through. Besides spending the morning picking up trash they are continuously making landscape improvements, adding new plants and rocks to create a more appealing landscaping. Their commitment is evident in their priority to have dead trees removed and new ones planted; ensuring the area remains lush and green. Regular lawn maintenance is the cornerstone of their efforts to include detailed attention to the sprinkler system, which they regularly check and have it repaired if needed. Unwanted signs are another target. The volunteers regularly remove any unauthorized/outdated signs, keeping the entrance clean and visually appealing. Enhancing the entrance's appearance is further demonstrated by the addition of flags for Flag Day, which brings a sense of pride and community to our neighborhood. These are taken care of by Leon Goodman. During the holiday season colorful lights and wreaths adorn the front entrance.

The impact of these volunteers' work is undeniable. The next time you drive through our Mall, just know, because of these volunteers and WPPCA's dedication and hard work ensures that the Winter Park Pines community entrance remains a beautiful and inviting gateway for all residents and visitors.

You Can Rule The Roost In Winter Park Pines!

Do you long for self-reliance? Love animal husbandry? Want to fight the rising cost of eggs?

Good news. If you own the Winter Park Pines home you live in, and your zoning code is single family home residential, you can keep up to four hens in your yard to raise your own eggs.

This initiative started in 2023 in order to promote sustainability and healthier lifestyles in our communities.

There are a few hoops to jump through before you get your permit. For example, a training class, inspections, application review and, in some cases, consent from your adjacent neighbors.

Branching Out... How Residents Can Restore Our Canopy

Winter Park Pines is experiencing a loss of mature Laurel Oaks as Orange County removes aging trees due to decay. Unlike city-managed areas, Unincorporated Orange County does not replace lost trees, leaving residents concerned about the disappearing canopy.



To take action, community residents are encouraged to contact District 5

Commissioner Kelly Martinez Semrad at *District5@ocfl.net* and advocate for a replanting program, and annexation to the City of Winter Park in future elections. Experts recommend replacing removed trees with Southern Live Oaks, which are stronger and more hurricane resistant.

Rebuilding the canopy benefits the neighborhood by reducing heat, improving air quality, and increasing property values. Protecting our trees today ensures a greener tomorrow.

<u>President Updates</u>: Directors & Committee Members Plus 1 had their 3rd annual social gathering with potluck food and beverage at Peter's house on 2/28/25 with 14 people in attendance sitting outside with a firepit on a beautiful night. The Mall Holiday Decorations Take Down Event had a good group of 6 folks on 1/11/25. Thanks to the volunteers, including Denise Ertler, Carol Magierski, Peter Mason, John Moore, Paul Olesen, and Kyle Schafer.

Peter had 4 residents contact him since the last recap. One said they had reported raised sidewalks in the Pines to Orange County. One reported a new owner on a house on Roughbeard Rd. One was concerned about a house on Sheriff Way that was not being kept up like the previous owner did. One reported a dead tree limb in the easement on Gilbert Rd.

Peter reported an email scam that was sent to a committee member wanting banking information. He reminded folks to be vigilant before responding to emails that don't seem legitimate.

<u>Secretary</u>: The BOD approved the February & March meeting minutes which are published in full on our website.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Ending 2/28/25, our YTD Total Income (Budget) @ \$26,874, Total Expenses @ \$4,268, and NOI @ \$22,606. Bank balance @ \$35,7753.

<u>Code Enforcement:</u> Over the last two months 13 incidents were reported, including a campers & junk in driveways/yards, theft, dead pine trees at the Mall entrance & on streets, assault, cars with expired tag and expired stickers, and an arrest for reckless driving. Also, an inquiry on the rules & regs of raising chickens which is allowed in Orange County with specific restrictions.

<u>Digital:</u> Website: February had 408 site visits, 274 unique visitors with 245 direct site visits, 88 from Google, 62 from Facebook, 5 from DuckDuckGo and 3 from Baidu.com. New visitors were 255 or 93% and returning visitors were 19 or 7%. Sessions by devices were 304 or 75% via Mobile, 100 or 35% via Desktop and 4 or 1% via Tablet. **Facebook**: Normal traffic with a lot of folks selling stuff. **Nextdoor**: Normal traffic. **Instagram**: Normal traffic.

Events: Official Winter Park Pines 2025 Spring Garage Sale: Was on 3/8/25 with 44 homes registered that had a lot of traffic throughout the Pines. A shredder truck (by Stericycle/Shred-It) and a donation truck (by Teen Challenge) were available at the Winter Park Pines Golf Club. A Budget Tree Service, Berkshire Hathaway Home Services, Pipeliner Pros and RE/MAX 200 Realty sponsored the shredder truck. The very successful event was organized by Michelle Deleon with volunteers including Denise Ertler, Fran Frataccia, Doug Lampe, Julie Lampe, Carol Magierski, Peter Mason, Joe McCluan, and Melissa Wolfe, Winter Park Pines Happy Hour Meet-Up:

Mall Updates: Committee members go to the Mall weekly picking up trash, weeding and pruning. They installed white rocks and colorful flowers by the entrance sign. They will install mulch in March. A solar light was installed for the ground light that was out. Crepe Myrtle trees were trimmed in February. An irrigation pump that was out of warranty was replaced for \$795. Orange County cut down some dead pine trees.

Membership: As of 3/10/25, membership dollars @ \$21,294; number of members @ 292; percentage of homes paid @ 32.4%. Versus prior year the number of members was down by 18 or 6%. The top-tier membership levels are 70 Gold and 6 Platinum members, 10 or 13% of these are new top-tier members. We are 2 members ahead of last year's top tier pace. A letter was sent in late January to 668 unpaid residents, reminding them to pay. Since that letter 58 residents have paid \$4,174, giving a potential ROI of 647% based on the mailing cost of \$645. The next mailing to 83 unpaid non-resident owners goes out late March. The new electronic payment system has been used by 85 residents recouping \$147 in processing fees. The new system captures a lot more resident information to be able to update our database.

<u>Needles</u>: The current issue is a 12-page color anniversary issue highlighting volunteer work and what some of our committees do. Future issues will highlight other committees and the work they do.

New Neighbor Welcome: Visits continue with about 10 each month with a combination of new residents and homes that we don't have residents' names to welcome all of them to Winter Park Pines. The tote bag contents which are left with residents have been supplemented by items from the OC Sheriff's Department. The information gathered allows our database to be updated and follow-up is done by the President with those that express interest in volunteering.

Yard of the Month: YOM has been on winter hiatus and resumes in April 2025. The program has been adding some new elements for winners in 2025 including an offering from Seby's Pizza. Looking for a garden center to partner with like in 2024.

<u>General Business</u>: Looking to partner with Orange County and a landscaper to replace the aging dead trees that are being taken down in the Pines.
